What have been the biggest rewards and benefits to sponsoring a local nonprofit?


The biggest reward to sponsoring a local non-profit is seeing the positive impact that organization has in the community in which we live and work, and knowing that support directly helps those within the community and local area.

DON'T BE NETTLED!

It's late summer, it's hot outside, and you want to go for a dip in the Bay or local river. You get ready to jump in and then you see ... is that a fish? a plastic bag? Wait, is that – a sea nettle? Atlantic sea nettles or jellyfish as we call them colloquially, are an umbrella shaped invertebrate that are free swimming and produce a sting that can cause moderate discomfort.

The sea nettle has a somewhat transparent jelly-like body with a big bell or dome top. It has a mouth located at the center of one end of the body which opens to a stomach-like cavity that is used for digestion. It has stinging cells, called nematocysts, in their tentacles that surround the mouth to capture food. They generally feed on zooplankton, other jellies and even small crustaceans. Sea nettles immobilize their prey using their stinging tentacles.
